From nuisance smells to contaminating ground and surface waters, septic system failures can pollute our watershed as well as create expensive repairs for the property owner.

Come and learn about how to create a regular maintenance routine to ensure your septic system continues to function properly and keep a happy balance between your wallet and the watershed.

LIVING IN BEAR COUNTRY

Did you know that before 1950 there were less than 100 black bears in NJ? Through wildlife management and research, NJ has been able to see the black bear population successfully increase. In Northwest NJ, more than 2300 black bears call these woods their home.

In April, the Liberty Twp. Environmental Commission hosted a Living with Bears workshop, presented by NJDEP Fish & Wildlife. This writer learned some great facts about bears and tips about being a good neighbor. Here are the top five bear facts and prevention tips:

- 1. Bears can smell food up to 3 miles away! Close the windows when baking your secret triple chocolate cake.
- 2. Lock your garbage cans, use a certified bear proof can or simply wait to place garbage out until collection morning. Even heard ammonia towels placed on top of garbage in the can will cover the odor.
- 3. If you and a bear are crossing paths: Always make loud noises and look big. NEVER make eye contact! Do not run. Slowly back away.
- 4. Largest number of bear complaints usually in March and August for NJ.
- 5. Black bears are false hibernators. So there winter sleep is not that deep. Be alert always.
