SEPTIC MANAGEMENT WORKSHOP RECAP

Best Septic Management Tips:

- ✓ Regular pumping about every 3 years
- ✓ New systems have effluent filters these baffles should be rinsed annually
- ✓ Conserve Water reduce use, fix drips, and upgrade appliances to more water efficient ones
- ✓ Avoid harmful cleaners that can kill good bacteria in a septic, such as bleach, ammonia, floor wax, and rug cleaners
- ✓ Use phosphate-free soaps and laundry detergents
- ✓ Avoid letting food, paper products, diapers, and toxic or flammable substances from getting down the drain
- ✓ Don't allow grease to get down the drain.
